WHAT IS THIS SMALL GROUP STUFF? WHAT ARE THEY TRYING TO DO TO US?

Well, I know there are questions out there - so let me try to ease your mind.

HOW DID THIS GET STARTED?

Back last fall we had a series of afternoons with the pastor - everyone was invited to come - in which we talked about you, and me, and we talked about a five week sermon series we were doing on the "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations." Out of those discussions and the study came some revealing facts about us as a church.

We did not have a plan to reach out to bring people into the church.

We did not have a plan of what to do with them when they got here.

We didn't even have a plan of how to get to know other people in our church or a way to nurture them or be nurtured ourselves.

We did not have an intentional way to grow deeper in our faith.

From the knowledge that we lacked intentional planning to make these things happen we decided that we wanted these things to happen in our church. The next logical step was to ask how can we make them happen. The answer was "It can happen more readily through small groups since small groups allow for greater diversity, quicker action, and less intimidation to new folks." Small groups would provide a good place for new people to plug into the ministry of the church, and more quickly feel a sense of belonging.

From this we formed the "Nurture Committee" to help us develop this ministry. The Nurture Committee decided that there are three overall goals we wanted to accomplish through each small group:

Connect with God - that is intentionally seek to grow our faith

Connect with each other - that is intentionally seek to get to know each other more deeply - nurture one another in our need - make room for each other's unique abilities and interests.

Connect with those in the community who need the grace of God that is so much a part of the life of our church - that is invite your friends, family, neighbors, and others to find belonging in our fellowship and walk with them as they come to belong.

Now, that doesn't sound all that scary does it? To me it sounds positive and exciting and affirming. To me it speaks of the elements which help build the church into a place where welcome is written all over our faces and underscores all that we do.

WHAT IS IT GOING TO REQUIRE OF ME?

We are asking that each small group meet once a month to care for one another, reach out to others, and grow in faith. Each group may choose to do all of these three things differently. That is one of the things that make these groups so special - they have ownership of their own group. A normal group might meet in someone's home for snacks, a devotional period, and discussion of what they want to do to bring people into the church, make any assignments to be carried out before the next meeting, pray and adjourn. Other groups may want the growth in faith part of their group to be that their group joins the small group Bible study the pastor leads each year, or a devotional led by a member of the group.

What is required is that you love our church, want our church to grow, want to grow in your faith, want to nurture one another, and want to have fun doing all these things. I sincerely believe that God is in what we are doing and leading our church to a brighter future filled with God's grace and power.

And finally, yes we want you to be part of a group because we believe it will be good for us all.

Dear Church Family and friends,

I have always found it to be that United Methodist people, once told the true situation, step up to quickly handle the problem with grace and understanding. I believe that will be the case as we share our present circumstance with you.

We have upcoming expenditures to make, less income than projected, and a reporting error that was not caught until there was not enough cash available to meet current obligations. The reporting error came about in relation to how we handled payroll taxes.

Eddie Scott explains: "Church staff, Weekday School staff, and Before/After school staff use the same payroll tax ID number, even though each is responsible for paying its own payroll taxes. Before 2010, payroll tax deposits were made by check, so each wrote a check for its own taxes out of its own funds, and the church submitted all three payments. Beginning in 2010, the church was required to change the way it made payroll tax deposits, and must now submit them electronically, rather than by check. Because of this change, only one payment can be made, so the church now submits one combined payment and receives reimbursement from the Weekday School and Before/After school for their respective portions. Once reimbursements are received, the church deposits these funds back into the General Fund bank account."

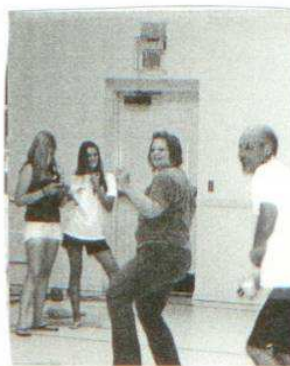
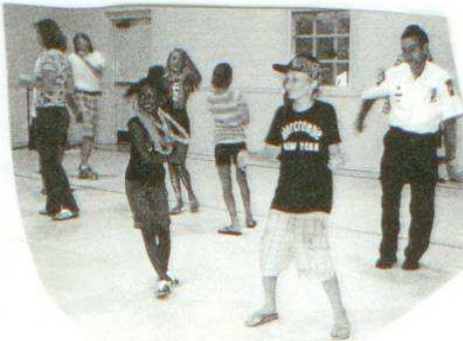
Eddie continues: "Contributions reported in the bulletin reflect total deposits to the bank, to include not only weekly congregational giving, but also the payroll tax reimbursements discussed above, as well as other reimbursements. The year-to-date contributions received reported in the Aug 1st bulletin incorrectly reflect \$173,492.94. The correct amount is \$152,997.97, which positions us \$19,015.65 under the budgeted amount of \$172,013.62. Although current expenses through this time period have fortunately also been under budget, there are still current and upcoming expenditures that need to be made and not enough cash available to make them." (After this letter was drafted, contributions for Sunday, Aug 1st totaled over \$12,000.)

The Finance Committee is revising the weekly financial reporting to reflect a more accurate and informative picture of our financial situation. This revision should be complete relatively soon. We apologize for not catching this error sooner. In addition, the Finance Committee will be discussing the matter at its next meeting, this week.

As many of you know, summer months can sometimes place a strain on the finances of any church; we are no exception. Please do what you can to step up to meet this need. Thank you for caring in this special way.

For more than ten years, you have come as carpenters and cooks, engineers, teachers, window washers, van drivers, card-game and checkers players, preachers and pastors, nurses, accountants, play ground supervisors, prayer partners, craft instructors, VBS leaders/helpers, mechanics, shoppers, parents, grandparents, children and teens.

Because of you more than 50,000 meals have been served to hungry people. Year after year, scores of children and teens have received school supplies, toiletries, homework help, and personal attention so remarkable that its value cannot be quantified. Girl Scouts have experienced success earning badges and serving our community as they learn to be good citizens. Two dozen children and teens sing praise to God each week in choir. More than thirty Spanish speaking adults study the Bible while their precious children play safely in our care. Homeless people receive warm blankets, babies get clean diapers, and isolated, hurting adults find sanctuary and care. And through you, God has called many others to help care for our neighbors and thereby know the heart of God.

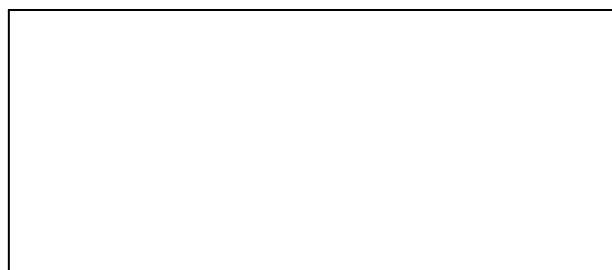

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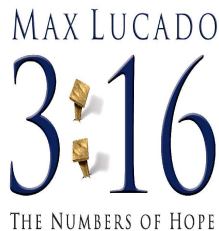

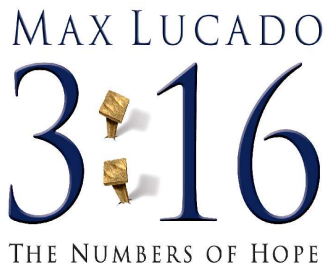


STUDY BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 12TH
