It is so easy to be overwhelmed by the needs of the world but, if we remember that even a small match lit in a place of total darkness gives off a blinding light, we can be assured that any little thing done with love will make a difference.

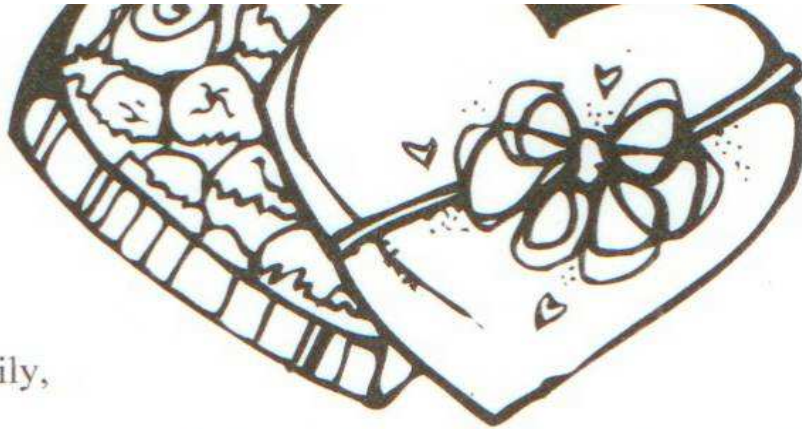

Stop Hunger Now—Saturday, May 7

Everyone had such a good time packaging meals last year that we decided to do it again. We will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 7 and, depending on how many meals we are able to package, should be done in a couple of hours.

We must raise a minimum of \$3,000 in order to buy the supplies necessary. In the weeks and months ahead, we will be having several fund raising events that promise to be fun. Already in the planning stages are:

March 12—St. Patrick's Day dinner and dance

April 10—Lunch after church that highlights the issues of hunger
