NEWS FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The Administrative Council of Pine Grove United Methodist Church met Tuesday, August 19, 2008 with 22 in attendance. Jean Darden called the meeting to order.

Pastor Neill opened with devotions emphasizing that our youth, young families, Bible study and service should be Pine Grove's priorities. We need to be a multi-generational church, blending our youth and adults with quality as our measuring stick. He also presented the council with statistics regarding the neighborhoods surrounding Pine Grove, emphasizing the great opportunities we have for service to our community.

The minutes were read from the April, 2008 meeting. Homer Craig made a motion to approve the minutes as read with Sandy Waldron Seconded. The motion carried.

Finance Committee—Eddie Scott reported on the General Budget Contributions received as follows: Actual through 8-17-08 \$175,901.00, Budget needed as of 8-17-08 \$184,375.00. and we are under budget by \$8,474.00.

Both the Conference Apportionments and the District Apportionments are current through August. The cash in the bank is \$8,851.00 with all invoices current. The balance in the Land & Capital Improvements Fund as of 8-17-08 is \$5,674.00 which is enough for 10 monthly principal and interest payments of \$543.00. The balance in the Capital Improvements Fund is \$8,181.00 which is enough for 8 monthly payments of \$943.00. Eddie also reminded committee chairpersons that their budget requests must be turned in before 9-16-08.

Trustees—Homer Craig reminded everyone of the work day coming up on Saturday, August 23. He also noted that all previous projects have been completed and suggested that anyone who sees areas of the church building that need attention or repairs to complete the forms provided in the church office and place them in the Trustees mail box. There was a great turnout for moving day for the pastor and his family.

Parsonage Committee—Sue Morgan reported that all unwanted furniture from the parsonage has been moved to the Meeting House.

Endowment Committee—Jack Bullington reported that the Endowment Committee elected to disburse \$3,000.00 to the Trustees for the new roof on the parsonage, \$500.00 to Polly Caudle for missions, \$400.00 to our youth and \$600.00 to the Worship Committee totaling \$4,500.00 in contributions. The current Endowment Fund balance is \$85,745.00. Memorials or contributions may be made to the Endowment Fund any time.

Children's Ministry—On behalf of Sally Scott, Eddie thanked everyone for their support of Bible School. There were over 50 participants from 3rd through 5th grades. They collected food and money for the food bank as well as school supplies. Trunk or Treat will be held on Halloween this year. They are also planning a visit to South Fork Assisted Living,

Youth Ministry—With 900 youth and 200 adults attending, Dennis Houle reported that the youth retreat to Spiritus was a great experience for everyone who attended. He saw how our youth were inspired by the teaching, the visual presentations on large screens as well as the musical presentations. He has expressed the desire to try to bring some of these elements into our church for our Youth. He and Jennifer are working on plans for next year's mission trip and in their next meeting, will be preparing the next 3 months schedule. Pastor Neill will also be meeting with the youth twice a month. They are looking forward to a great year.

Outreach Committee and Scouts—Polly Caudle thanked everyone for the support of the mission trip to Arizona. She will have a power Point and DVD presentation of the trip in the future. Pine Grove will be participating in Operation Christmas Child again this year. The shoe boxes for the children will need to be filled and turned in by November 16 so they can be delivered by November 17.

Sandy Waldron suggested that the committee look into changing from Operation Christmas Child to the Agape Program which is a similar program supported by the Methodist Church. Polly and Sandy agreed to look into this further. They are also planning to do the Samaritan Ministries Penny Campaign which will support the Samaritan Soup Kitchen and Shelter. Bring your donations to the Narthex and place in the marked jars. The deadline for all contributions is December 6. Girl Scouts will begin again after Labor Day and will meet every other Tuesday in the Meeting House. There are two troops this year. Polly added that she and Dee Anne Fortescue will be recruiting players for the Christmas Nativity. Please contact either of them if you are interested in participating.

Before and After School—Peggy Sizemore announced that Linda Houle is our new Before and After School Program Director. They are currently interviewing for the Assistant Director Position. If any one is interested or knows of someone who would be interested in the position, please contact Peggy Sizemore.

Weekday School—Margaret McLeod reported that 40 children attended Summer Fun. 70 children have enrolled for the upcoming year. The teachers will begin August 25 and the children will begin after Labor Day.

Sandy Waldron stated that The Conference Committee for Mission and Outreach will focus on world hunger over the next four years. They are hoping to set up a “World Desk” for collecting and exchanging information on mission opportunities.

Peggy Williams reminded everyone that the deadline for getting information in the newsletter is Monday, August 25. If you would like information posted on the sign, fill out the form with the information and turn it in to the church office. Charge Conference will be on November 9. All information to be in the reports for the conference must be in the District Office by October 27 so please get the information in prior to that date.

Polly Caudle stressed the importance of the church office being closed on Mondays and asked that everyone please **NOT** visit the office end of the building on that day. This is a crucial day for recording church financial information.

Pastor’s Report—Pastor Neill brought up the idea of all committees meeting at the same time and location prior to the Administrative Council Meeting. By each committee meeting together at the same time and location, any issues that may arise in one committee that may involve another committee’s input, could be addressed or resolved immediately. The idea is to be more effective and more efficient. We could have a pot luck meal, have our committee meetings then go directly into the Administrative Council meeting. After some discussion, Dennis Houle made the motion to 1) ask the Nominating committee to avoid duplicating persons on committees with the exception of those called for in the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and 2) beginning in January, have all committees meet together at the same time and location with the Administrative Council meeting immediately following. Homer Craig seconded and the motion carried.

Jean Darden noted the next meeting will be October 21, 2008.

Pastor Neill closed with prayer. The meeting was Adjourned.

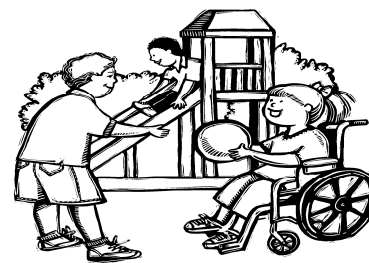
